We offer every student a fabulous education, and I am always willing to answer any questions about what we do and how we do it.

Educational research supports homework to help “develop good study habits, foster positive attitudes toward school, and communicate to students the idea that learning takes work at home as well as at school.” (Classroom Instruction that Works by Marzano, pg. 62) Some other tips from the Marzano book include that the purpose of the homework should be identified and articulated. The purpose should be for either practice or for preparation and background knowledge. In addition, homework should be less for lower grades. This advice matches the Holy Rosary Policies outlined in our handbook. What can you do to help your child with their homework?

- Set up a consistent organized place for homework
- Help provide a consistent schedule for completing homework
- Encourage, motivate, and prompt your child, but do not sit with them (except for reading homework).
- Ask your child what parts they understand and what parts they do not understand. If your child is consistently unable to communicate about the knowledge they are practicing or using, please communicate any confusion with the teacher.
- If it is bed time, stop your child even if their homework is incomplete.

Thank you for taking the time to help your child in all areas of their academic. Together, the parents and the school can help to make a child's education a great experience.

Family Faith Formation

Jesus told us that the sacrament of Baptism is necessary for salvation (Jn 3:5) and commanded His disciples to go to all nations and baptize in His name (Mt 28:19). He gave no other certain way for a person to enter into the kingdom of God. This is why the church baptizes infants and has such a missionary character. Baptism is the ordinary means by which we enter God's family. And yet...

The unbaptized who suffer martyrdom for the faith are said to have received *Baptism of blood*, and are saved.

Those who are preparing for Baptism, and have repented of sin and practice charity, but die before receiving are saved by *Baptism of desire*.

Those who are ignorant of the gospel but seek truth and act according to their understanding of the will of God, can be saved.

Our Lord's desire to save all mankind, and His tenderness toward children, allow us to hope for the salvation of children who have not been baptized.

Our duty as Christians is to proclaim the gospel and invite others to Baptism, to ensure the Baptism of children in our care, and to pray for those who die without the sacrament.
