Summer Homework Checklist:

Reading:

- A completed IF Library Summer Reading Program form. At least 4 of the books that you read as part of the program must be novels and meet the following requirements:
 - * have a 4.5 AR level or higher (You can check a book's A.R. level by going to arbookfinder.com)
 - * be a minimum of 125 pages long
 - * be fiction
 - * be highlighted or have a star next to them on the Reading Program form
- Choose one of the four novels you read as part of the Library Reading Program for your Cereal Box Book Project. **You will do this assignment when school starts.** You can easily install the **free Overdrive App** for I pads or android phones/tablets so that you can download books even if you are traveling this summer. <https://app.overdrive.com/>

Math:

- Complete 4 Prodigy assignments. (each assignment will be 50 questions long, I will email you the due dates for each assignment)

Writing:

- Write 10 journal entries in this year's Weekend Journal. (Each entry should be at least 5-8 sentences long and must have a response from a parent or older family member.)

Community Service:

- Complete at least 1 hour of community service for a friend or family member.
- Complete at least 1 hour of community service for a legitimate non-profit organization (ie: John Paul II Parish, Red Cross, Snake River Animal Shelter, Food Bank).
- Have your family email me photos of you completing your two hours of community service. (I will print out your photos and have them ready so that you can make a poster for your community service presentation once school starts.)
- Prepare a 5-8 minute presentation about your experience doing your community service. You will explain what you did and what you learned from the experience. This should be written and you should have it memorized before returning to school.

Failure to complete your summer homework will result in:

- Missing out on our "Back to School Party"
- Not receiving a prize
- Missing one recess every day, and all specials until your summer homework is completed
- Beginning the year with poor grades in Math, Reading, Writing, Art, and Citizenship

All summer homework is due the first day of school. If you complete it early by registration and hand in your library form that day, then you will receive a prize!
